HOLY COMMUNION: The Lord's Supper is celebrated on the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Sundays of the month, at our monthly Saturday night service, and on special feast and festival days. **Concerning the Lord's Supper:** Those who take part in the Lord's Supper actually consume bread and wine (1 Cor. 10:17; 11:27). But more than that, they also receive a miracle in bread and wine, for therein Christ places His true body and true blood (1 Cor. 10:16). As His body and blood can be taken to one's judgment (1 Cor. 11:29), the

congregations of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod have promised to practice closed communion. We desire to commune confirmed members in good standing of LCMS congregations. This practice bears loving witness to the Bible's concern for doctrinal oneness in receiving communion (1 Cor. 1:10; 2 John 1:9-11). If you are a guest among us from a different Christian confession (denomination), we kindly ask that you respect our practice and speak with the pastor before communing in our midst. 
The Father Answers Our Prayers Because of Jesus

"Truly, truly, I say to you, whatever you ask of the Father in my name, he will give it to you" (John 16:23). To pray in Jesus' name is to pray as one who has been baptized. For it is in the water that He put His name upon you, claiming you as His own, making you a son of God with access to the Father. By His incarnation and crucifixion, our Lord Jesus broke through the barrier of sin which separated us from God, opening a portal to the Father. To pray in Jesus' name is to pray with faith in Him as the one Mediator between God and men, who gave Himself a ransom for all (1 Tim. 2:1–6). Like Moses in the wilderness, Jesus is our go-between and intercessor before the throne of heaven. He was lifted up for us on the cross that we might be saved and restored to fellowship with the Father (Num. 21:4–9). Looking into this perfect teaching of liberty (James 1:22–27) we pray with boldness and confidence as dear children of God.



The Words of Our Lord






